#### Introduction

- Import SystmOne Referral Data (non-Read coded), St Gemma's Hospice in Leeds

- Option to customise whether IPOS data is grouped by day or not.
- Colour co-ordinated bar charts based on staff or patient completion

## **IPOS Report Updates**

### **Addition of Service Improvement Score Graph to Summary Report Page**



**Summary**: The A – E school style grading mechanism has been removed, as it leant a false sense of the positive or negative connotations of score movement. This has now been replaced with a "General Change" column, showing the net change of the percentage relative to 50%.

As before, a score of less than 50% shows people are generally deteriorating in this measurement, and a score of about 50% shows people are generally improving.

Now the General Change column shows a positive percentage if people are improving and a negative score if people are deteriorating, for each IPOS indictor.






## **Introduction of IPOS Questionnaire Patient Count**

### **Import SystmOne Referral Data**

**Summary**: Previously, only organisations using Read codes to services could filter by Service within the report. This update enables you to import Service Offered information using a Referral report within SystmOne.

#### **Introduction of AKPS Read code**

**Summary**: The AKPS Read code will now be importable via a SystmOne Clinical report for the A, functioning the same was as importing Phase of Illness Read codes.

There is no dedicated sheet to AKPS at this time, but the information will be available when using the Review Patient tab, to compare AKPS score with Phase of Illness and IPOS Scores, as shown in the screenshots.

#### **Customisable Dashboard view**


**Summary**: A new dashboard view enabling you to create an easy-to-use list of all patients who have completed a questionnaire. Filter by phase change, service and time frame. The dashboard shows all patients with a questionnaire in the time frame, showing the most recent questionnaire meeting the criteria, and the one before that so you can quickly spot changes.

The output presents a list of all patients with one or more IPOS questionnaire completed in the selected timeframe. It shows the most recent IPOS questionnaire, and the previous one to that questionnaire.

Phase of Illness and Service shows alongside the NHS number of the patient, and the date of the questionnaire.

This graph also features the distribution of change for your selected dashboard, which has been moved here from the Summary Report page.

The end of the graph presents an average score and change for each indicator, for the specific criteria you have filtered by.






### **Customisable Spider Graph**

**Summary**: Similarly to the new dashboard view, the customisable spider graph view enables you to generate a spider of all patients who have completed two questionnaires with the criteria you need. Filter by phase change, service and time frame.





## **IPOS Timeline tool Updates**

#### Bar charts - Show who recorded

**Summary**: The bar charts will have an option to be coloured by whether a staff member or patient has entered the information. This will make It possible to differentiate who has recorded IPOS data on the bar chart view of this information.

### **Change to Import Function**

**Summary**: When importing IPOS information to the timeline tool, the user will be prompted as to whether they wish to amalgamate all information from a day into a given output, or whether to import each IPOS questionnaire individually.

The first option means that, if a single questionnaire was recorded over multiple events, it will be amalgamated into one event to provide a cleaner presentation of the data. However if someone had multiple questionnaires in one day, only the last on of the day will be shown.

The second option means that every instance of an IPOS questionnaire being started on SystmOne will appear as a separate event, so if someone completes multiple questionnaires a day, they will all show.

You can set this to remember your choice so it doesn't ask every time, or change it
